Iron Vision: To build an unshakable brotherhood in Christ—men who fight boldly for truth and righteousness, lead their families, strengthen their churches, and serve their communities with wisdom, courage, honor, and love.

Iron Mission: Iron Academy exists to glorify God by training young men to live wisely, be unwavering in faith, and adept in leadership; equipping them to fight for biblical values, strengthen their families, and serve as leaders in their churches and communities.

School History: Iron Academy was founded in 2013 as an all-male, private Christian middle school and has added a grade level each year to graduating our first senior class in June 2020. All students take a college preparatory curriculum with a minimum of 24 credits to graduate. We are intentionally a small school with a 15:1 student to faculty ratio that allows us to have strong student-faculty relationships focused on developing character and leadership within our diverse student body. Our school name is taken from Proverbs 27:17, “As iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another.”

Course offerings:

- **Dual Enrollment:** In 2022, Iron Academy began offering 5 dual enrollment courses with The College at Southeastern:
 - Honors Algebra 2
 - Honors Constitution
 - Honors Language & Composition (I and II)
 - Honors World Geography
 - Honors World History
 - Honors US History
 - Honors Intro to the Christian Religion
 - Honors Physics
- **AP:** AP Calculus.
- **Honors:** 20 honors courses are available.

GPA Scale:

Our unweighted GPA is the typical A = 4 quality points, B = 3 quality points, etc. Our weighted GPA is on a 6.0 scale giving students in Honors classes an additional +1 quality point and AP classes an additional +2 quality points if the student takes the course's AP exam.

Class Ranking:

Given the intentionally small size of our graduating classes and the rigorous academic curriculum, Iron Academy does not rank its students.

Grading Scale:

Iron Academy's passing mark is 60. (90-100 = A, 80-89 = B, 70-79 = C, 60-69 = D, and 0-59 = F).

Extracurricular Offerings:

Our athletics options are cross-country, soccer, basketball, golf, and wrestling. Club offerings have included Strategy Club (strategy board games), and Marksmanship.

Calendar:

We have four quarter grading periods, with courses being yearlong and lasting 45-minutes daily. Typically, students are enrolled in five or six core academic classes per school year with the option to add additional electives.

Students are elected by their peers for the following leadership roles. Leadership Elective credit is earned by fulfilling responsibilities.

- **School Leader** – runs daily convocation, works with staff to address disciplinary issues, mentors students
- **School Marshal** – assists the school leader
- **Tribe Leader** – speaker for their respective tribe, oversees daily chores, initiates conflict-resolution principles
- **Squires** – facilitate activities and encourage new students who attend Crucible Camp
- **Student Keepers** – mentor and disciple smaller peer groups
